

CHANGE YOUR NAIL SHAPE

In the spring, a woman's fancy lightly turns to a new ward-robe. Can you blame her? After a long winter—and all the layers required to survive it—it's only right we begin to obsess about the lighter styles we'll soon be slipping into.

If you're a fashion junkie, you will have already mapped out which pastel shift or metallic pumps you'll be getting this season. But the fastest way to update for spring (and give winter the finger, while you're at it) is a new manicure. Yes, you know all about the reverse French manicure beauty editors have been crowing about for the past year (where your nail moons rather than tips get painted in a contrasting shade) but what really sets you apart this spring is a manicure of a different form: you should change your nail shape.

Leeanne Colley, owner of Tips Nail Bar in Toronto, is one expert editors flock to when they want to re-create nail looks spied on international runways. She calls the new, slightly longer and elongated look of spring nails an almond or stiletto shape. "Nails are longer this spring. Most women are staying away from that sharp, square look. The look is more feminine now." And while bright colours and unusual textures are popular, this nail shape looks particularly chic and feminine in soft, pale neutrals. Which, as anyone with a manicure habit will tell, is a basic nightmare. Long, pale nails? Hello, chips!

Deborah Fulsang, Body Editor at The Kit, understands why trimmed, vamp-painted manicures have had such a long run of popularity. "Many of us loved that



shade hid a multitude of sins." But the advent of the Shellac or soak-off gel manicures, which can last two weeks and add considerable strength to nails, is causing women to give this new nail shape a second look.

If your nails are still just breaking even with your finger tips, it will only take between six to eight weeks for them to grow to the perfect almond shape. Colley recommends going no further than a tip that's two-thirds as long as your nail bed (the pink part from cuticle up). "It looks balanced. Anything longer and it will create stress on your nail and you'll get cracks." She warns that it takes a bit of time getting accustomed to the feel of longer nails but says you'll soon be used to opening your diet Coke with a coin or a key.

Can't wait for your nails to grow before trying out the new shape? Fulsang says that "you can cheat this long, oval look with the new'silhouette' manicure. It's where a light or neutral shade is used as the base coat and then the centre of the nail is painted a deeper, darker or more vibrant shade. You create the illusion of longer nails."

But the most appealing aspect of a new nail look is that it demands little in the way of commitment to embrace your brand new thing. "It's 10 little accessories added to your look," says Colley.



DREE HEMINGWAY FOR SANDRO


