I'm honeymooning in Paris and Barcelona for two weeks and want to travel with only a carry-on. What should I pack, and what should I buy there? —Laura

DEAR LAURA:

Lucky you! I can't imagine a more romantic city for a honeymoon than Paris, and Barcelona is always so joyful. But I must say, you're very gutsy to go away for two whole weeks with nothing more than carry-on luggage. Still, if that's your style, good for you!

First, you'll want your wardrobe to go from casual to dressy, since I'm sure your outings will be varied. Take two dresses, one in chic black with simple lines you won't tire of, that won't wrinkle (matte jersey is great) and can be accessorized. Choose a colourful, easy-to-wear dress for daytime, perhaps in cotton with a full, flirty

skirt. You may want another skirt, jeans and jeggings.

Take four tops minimum, plus a lightweight cardigan, and a waterproof nylon jacket. A pashmina is a very practical piece, if you can fit it in your luggage or wear it on the airplane.

Pack ballet flats or moccasinstyle loafers, sandals and heeled pumps (if you're planning elegant dinners). I usually travel in a pair of comfy Frye boots. As long as I have stylish and solid boots, I feel like I'm ready for anything.

You'll need one cool jacket that you can dress up or down. I'd choose lightweight leather, in either a blazer or biker style, that'll serve you on

chilly nights. Carry a big tote and pack a purse or clutch for nighttime. And bring a bathing suit; you never know when the opportunity to take a dip might arise.

THE "I DO" HAIRDO

Fresh-from-the-runway looks you'll fall for and how to explain them to your stylist

1. Retro Starlet

FOR THE BRIDE WHO loves her vintage diamond. ASK FOR soft, brushed-out curls. Request that your stylist curl hair in vertical sections and loosely pin the ends into a small, horizontal braid at the nape of your neck. Finish with shine spray.

2. Glamazon

FOR THE BRIDE WHO is high-maintenance and proud. ASK FOR staying power and volume, and the best fine-mist, strong-hold hairspray to stash in your bag. For a less retro vibe, request less height at the crown.

3. Modern Rule Breaker

FOR THE BRIDE WHO loves contrast. ASK FOR a ponytail with wave, texture and just a few wispy bits pulled out to show that this is a hairstyle, not the aftermath of an updo you hated and ripped out en route to the altar.

4. Princess Bride

FOR THE BRIDE WHO is a hopeless romantic. ASK FOR softness around the face. Request that your stylist curl your tresses to create easy waves before the braided twist is secured. Randomly placed flowers complete the look.

5. Chic Minimalist

FOR THE BRIDE WHO is a purist. ASK FOR a pre-wedding treatment schedule, with colour touch-ups, so hair looks its healthiest. Request your stylist's advice on whether to wear the twist with a centre or side part or pull it all back

A STEP-BY-STEP **GUIDE TO BEING** PICTURE-PERFECT

SIX MONTHS BEFORE ESTABLISH A REGIMEN

Consult an aesthetician to prioritize your goals, such as evening out skin tone, eliminating blemishes or hydrating, and create a daily routine. "It should include cleanser, toner, serums and moisturizers." savs Kim Benistv. trainer for Elizabeth Arden. Then, book monthly facials.

THREE MONTHS BEFORE START YOUR BODY PREP &

TEST-DRIVE A SPRAY TAN "Any skin that will be exposed should be pampered and prepped," says Benisty.

Visit a spa for a full-body scrub. (Don't neglect your décolletage if you're wearing a strapless dress!) While you're there, book that same treatment for a week before the wedding.

If you're considering a spray tan, test-drive it after your scrub. "Now is the time to play with and adjust your look," says Benisty. "Try a non-alcohol-based spray tan at a reputable salon, and opt for a light-to-medium intensity. The goal is to look even-toned and sun-kissed not orangey

ONE TO TWO MONTHS BEFORE

This is a high-stress time, says Benisty, and your skin may be showing it. Resist the urge to introduce new products to treat lacklustre skin, breakouts or dehydration. Instead, stick to your routine, and foster healthy habits -go to the spa or a yoga class, or take a day off to relax

ONE MONTH BEFORE

Visit your dentist to discuss having your teeth whitened or starting to use an at-home whitening kit. Beginning now means you'll achieve the right shade and avoid tooth sensitivity or a too-white smile on the big day.

ONE WEEK BEFORE

It's the perfect time for the fullbody exfoliation you booked three months ago. This is especially important for an even spray tan, if you're planning one

TWO TO THREE DAYS BEFORE

Enjoy a facial (no extractions!) and a stress-busting full-body massage. Get your spray tan, if you're having one. (Doing it now makes sure the colour won't rub off on your dress.)

THE NIGHT BEFORE

Rest, stay hydrated, avoid caffeine and get at least eight hours of sleep (if you can!).

THE BIG DAY

MOISTURIZE AND PRIME Start the day with a hydrating facial mask or moisturizing serum, says Benisty. Then use a primer before applying makeup. It will help you achieve a velvety complexion and minimize the appearance of pores and fine lines. And smile: It's the single best way to improve how you look!

interview

David Dixon

The Toronto-based designer was cherry picked to create a line of bridal gowns for Kleinfeld Hudson's Bay, which opens this May. He debuted the collection at Toronto fashion week fall/winter 2014, and talked to us about what he learned

GROWING UP I WAS AN EXTREMELY SHY KID. I was always doodling and writing or drawing on whatever paper I could find. My whole family is extroverts; I'm sort of the odd one out.

ON FRIDAYS WHEN I WAS YOUNG I was allowed to stay up later watching television. I'd always illustrated people and clothes, and then I saw an episode of *The Love Boat* with Geoffrey Beene Halston and I suddenly realized, "Oh my goodness, you can do this, it can be a living!"

MY MOTHER WAS VERY FORWARD-THINK-ING—my parents both emigrated from Ireland in the '50s and I'm the youngest of six children, so it was a busy household, but they always encouraged us to do what we wanted to do.

MY PARENTS HAD A DOUBLE WEDDING WITH MY UNCLE AND HIS WIFE. My mom had fiery red hair, was unconventional, smart and said whatever was on her mind. She didn't want to make the other bride, who had decided to wear white, feel uncomfortable, so she wore a tailored pink suit she had and my father got a matching tie. They were married for 53 years.

INITIALLY I THOUGHT, "ARE YOU SURE YOU'RE ASKING THE RIGHT PEOPLE?" when Kleinfeld approached me asking if I would be interested in doing a collection for them. They wanted to include Canadian designers who were not specifically bridalwear labels. I jumped at the chance.

I WATCHED MARATHONS OF SAY YES TO THE DRESS as part of my research and I thought, I can't really compete at this because those designers have bridal wear in their DNA and have mastered those techniques. I decided to design for the woman I already design for—who I have in my head. I wanted the collection to be clean, romantic, but something they felt like themselves in.

THIS WAS A REAL LEARNING CURVE IN TERMS OF CONSTRUCTION, the treatments of how light reflects on white. I thought, "Why is this matching in this room but not in this room?" It was because the lighting was different. I have a new respect for people who work in bridal.


SOMEONE ONCE ASKED ME "ARE THERE ANY RULES IN BRIDAL DESIGN?" The only rule should be that you love the person you're standing with and you're truthful in the vows you're saying. Everything else is icing on the cake.

I HAVE 15- AND 13-YEAR-OLD SONS. They eat, sleep and play video games. They have lots of clothes, so I find myself thinking, "Why do you have to keep wearing the Angry Bird shirt?" They don't necessarily have an interest in fash-

ion, but they do know what they like and

what colours they like.




